## READINGS

1<sup>st</sup> Reading: Habakkuk 1:2-3, 2:2-4

2<sup>nd</sup> Read: 2 Timothy 1:6-8, 3-14

Gospel: Luke 17:5-10

### **Scripture Reflection**

Jesus, in response to the request of the disciples to increase their faith, assured them that if they have little faith as big as a mustard seed they will be able to do humanly impossible things. Mustard seed is very small but still it has the inherent ability to grow to a big tree (Luke 13:18-19). Faith though little also has immense power in it to work miracles. Faith is both a fruit, and a charism of the Holy Spirit. Faith as fruit is needed for one's salvation. Faith as charism is power to work miracles, or do impossible things. In Luke 17: 5-6 Jesus deals with faith as charism of the Holy Spirit.

In the second part of today's Gospel Jesus tells the parable of the unworthy servant. In the parable of the vigilant servant (Luke 12:35-38) the Master seems to be grateful to the vigilant servants and he

himself serves them at table. But in the parable of the unworthy servant Jesus advices not to expect any reward or appreciation from the master of the house. The disciples have to perform the duties of their their ministry as if they are unworthy instruments in the hands of God. It is God who performs everything through them. So there is nothing to be proud of. If we get the reward here on earth then we do not have any right to ask for it in heaven.

#### OCTOBER- MONTH OF ROSAARY DEVOTION

#### **Louis Marie Montfort about Rosary:**

Therefore they should arm themselves with the frequent meditation on the life, virtues and sufferings of Our Blessed Lord — which are so beautifully contained in the 15 mysteries of the Holy Rosary."

"If you say the Rosary faithfully until death, I do assure you that, in spite of the gravity of your sins you shall receive a never-fading crown of glory. Even if you are on the brink of damnation, even if you have one foot in hell, even if you have sold your soul to the devil as sorcerers do who practice black magic, and even if you are a heretic as obstinate as a devil, sooner or later you will be converted and will amend your life and will save your soul, if — and mark well what I say — if you say the Holy Rosary devoutly every day until death for the purpose of knowing the truth and obtaining contrition and pardon for your sins."
