Readings

1st Reading: Isaiah 7:10-14 2nd Reading: Romans 1:1-7 Gospel: Mathew 1:18-24

Scripture Reflections

In the first reading, the prophet Isaiah gives a sign from God to King Ahaz of Judah: "Behold, a virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and his name shall be called Emmanuel" (Is 7:14). Matthew considers this prophecy as one of the most descriptive and definite prophecies foretelling the future Messianic King, the Christ, who is to be born as a descendant of David. The Refrain for today's Responsorial Psalm (Ps 24), "Let the Lord enter; He is King of Glory" reminds us that we must choose to let Jesus enter our hearts to rule our lives, for God never forces us to receive His gifts. In the second reading, Paul asserts that Jesus was a descendant of David and thus the Messiah: "from David according to the flesh," become Incarnate as Jesus, but

was revealed and established by the Father as Son of God in power by his Resurrection from the dead. Then Paul provides a sweeping mighty acts in history through summary of God's Christ. Today's Gospel, from Matthew, focuses on the person and role of Joseph. Unlike Ahaz the king of Judea Joseph wholeheartedly surrendered his will and plan to that of God. He was ready to do what God asked him to do without questioning. This is a sublime expression of faith in God. For an ordinary man like him it was not easy to understand that Mary had conceived by the power of the Holy Sprit as it was announced by the Angel. Faith demands such total surrender of personal plan and conceding to the plan of God. As we are approaching Christmas let us pray that we also be able to grow in such faith. Christmas is a celebration of God emptying himself to be with man in all trivialities of life. He condescended to the status of weak human beings to assure of His presence in our midst which is a source of strength and consolation for us.
